Action required - iMatter Historical Team Information Notification for Managers From this Friday (17 November), historical team iMatter information i.e. team reports, action plans, and story boards more than 5 years old will no longer be held on the iMatter system. If you wish to retain team information that is older than 5 years, please download and save **before Friday**. This must be done in line with our policies and protocols for the storage and security of information and data:

Safety Action Notice (SAN) - risk of fire from clinical waste eurobins Following a fire test carried out recently on the non-metallic waste eurobins, a SAN has been issued to all health boards regarding the potential fire risk of our clinical waste eurobins. The SAN states: "Bins and other waste containers manufactured from combustible materials may pose a major fire risk from accidental or malicious ignition and seriously impact on occupant evacuation if stored in escape routes, including corridors, stair enclosures, and protected lobbies." If you are based in a service/on a site with non-metallic waste bins in public areas, you must review current procedures with a view to mitigating any risk of fire and implement the following steps:

- All non-metallic bins must be kept locked at all times.
- Bins should not be sited in stairwells try and find alternative location if possible.
- If bins must be kept in public areas, wherever possible try and remove them to secure storage overnight or when sites get quieter.
- Reduce the number of bins in use across sites this would require existing bins to be serviced or exchanged more often.
