Winter vaccination programme – PHS want your views Public Health Scotland are working in collaboration with all boards to gather your feedback on the Winter 2023 vaccination programme via a short online national survey. They want to hear from all health & social care workers, including people who work in care homes, or care at home teams, working in Scotland. Whether or not you took up the offer of vaccination your views are vital. What was good about your experience? What needs to improve? This will inform the development of the winter programme, and all vaccination programmes. The survey is completely confidential: individual answers will not be shared with your employer, and neither your employer nor the research team will know who you are. The survey should take a maximum of 10 minutes to complete and is open until 5pm on 5 March.

Important Notice: Out-of-Hours, Emergency Pharmacy Service Due to a high volume of calls and an increasing number of unnecessary calls, we want to clarify the purpose of the out-of-hours, emergency pharmacy service. The on-call pharmacist is available out of hours for clinically urgent pharmaceutical advice and pharmacy supplies which cannot wait until the next working day. The on-call pharmacist works remotely from home and provides this cover for all hospital services. You should only contact the on-call pharmacist with the following:

- Supply of **critical** medicines for inpatient use.
- **Urgent** medicines information or advice which cannot be answered using normal resources (e.g., Medusa, BNF etc).

Note: Please refer clinical decisions to the parent medical team/senior. The on-call pharmacist is not the most appropriate decision maker in these circumstances and will unlikely be able to help. Thank you for your cooperation.
