Reminder – drop-in vaccination clinics, ARI If you have still to get your 'flu and/or COVID-19 jab, you can head to Level 3, Yellow Zone, ARI between 9.30am and 4pm tomorrow and Thursday (7 & 8 December). No appointments necessary; at busy times you may be asked to come back later.

Please use the stairs (opposite M&S on the concourse) to get to Level 3, leaving the lift free for patients attending the Eye Clinic.

If you aren't based at Foresterhill, remember health & social care staff can drop into any vaccination centre in Grampian. We have clinics in Elgin, Huntly, Peterhead, Fraserburgh, Macduff, Inverurie, Banchory, and Stonehaven. The main Aberdeen clinic is in the former John Lewis, with smaller clinics in Airyhall and Bridge of Don. All clinics in Aberdeenshire, along with Airyhall and Bridge of Don, are open Monday-Friday. Fiona Elcock Vaccination Centre in Elgin is open Monday-Saturday; Aberdeen City Vaccination Centre is open 7 days a week.

School industrial action Members of the SSTA and NASUWT unions will take strike action in Moray, Aberdeen City, and Aberdeenshire this Thursday. Closures and partial closures have been confirmed by all three councils; parents and carers should have had direct communication from their school. As you'll be aware, if this disruption affects your ability to attend work, it is important you have an urgent conversation with your line manager to discuss the use of annual leave, parental leave, TOIL, working at home, or rearranging shifts as appropriate.

Royal Mail strikes There will be walkouts at Royal Mail this Friday and Sunday (9 & 11 December). There will be no change to our internal postal service, but there will be delays to collection and onward delivery by Royal Mail and all services should plan accordingly.
