National IPC Manual – now on your desktop We often refer to the National Infection Prevention & Control Manual (NIPCM) in this brief. This is where national guidance and resources can be found about IPC and is the basis for IPC practice in NHS Grampian. It sets the standard for infection prevention & control for anyone involved in patient care and is considered best practice in health and care settings. A shortcut to the NIPCM has been added to the desktop of every NHS device (see image below), making it even more straightforward for you to access the best and latest advice.



We are aware some of you have had issues connecting to the NIPCM website when working at home; this has now been resolved.

Retire and Return Interim retire and return arrangements are in place to support retiring employees by offering an accelerated process, after retiring and claiming pension benefits, to return on a part-time basis to:

- Your own role or
- A different role in the same job family (e.g., nursing, medical & dental, admin) at the same or a lower band for which a Retire and Return register has been created to facilitate this.

All vacancies are assessed against those employees on the redeployment register for reasons of health, organisational change etc and there will be no change to this. If the vacancy is not appointed to through this route, consideration will now be given to those on the Retire and Return register. If the vacancy is not appointed to through either route, it will go to advert.

A process to support employees to retire and return has the potential to reduce some of the effects of changed pension provisions, workforce supply issues, and the transfer of specialist knowledge and skills. There is no right for an employee to return to work automatically following their retirement, however, these arrangements offer an accelerated route to support a return to work and potentially benefits both employer and employee.

<u>The Retirement Planning & Administration Policy</u> has further information (intranet link, networked devices only). If you are retiring but plan to return via a bank post, or a part time position in a different job family, this will follow the standard recruitment process.
