Cybersecurity risks As per the standalone Global email issued earlier, we want to remind everyone working in health & social care of the heightened level of cybersecurity risk at present. Holiday weekends, such as the one we are approaching, have been used by criminals in the past to launch large scale cyber-attacks on public organisations. Please remember these simple points of good practise:

- Guard against Phishing attacks if an email looks suspicious it probably is; if in doubt, delete it and contact the IT service Desk
- Do not share your password with anyone
- Do not leave passwords with your computer or mobile device
- Do not write passwords down and leave for others to see

Criminals can and will use information learned about individuals on their social media accounts to make Phishing attacks seem more convincing. If you use social media, whether personally or on behalf of a service, please take the time to review your security and privacy settings.

No Mow May As you may have spotted on our social media accounts this week, NHS Grampian is taking part in No-Mow May. This means some of our sites will be left to their natural devices in the coming weeks and the grass will not be cut. This will enable us to see which pollinators (butterflies, bumblebees etc.) pay us a visit, and where. In the last 50 years there has been a massive decline in the pollinator populations, because their natural habitat has been lost.
